What is in the STP?

- The STP reverts to proposals to downgrade
 A&E at Charing Cross to a 'local hospital' level
- STP identifies need for 'savings' of £1.3bn by 2020/21
- Social care funding 'gap' of £145m by 2020/21
- Doubts if savings plans are realistic given lack of joined up health and social care
- Future of St Quintin Health Centre remains uncertain – still caught up in NHS Property Review

Air quality in our area

- since 2010 the UK has been in breach of the EU objective for NO2, particularly across central London
- lifetime exposure to current levels of air pollution in RBKC will reduce the lifespan of all residents by an average of nearly 16 months
- In RBKC since 2005 CO2 emissions have fallen at a lower rate than in other local authorities in London
- Council has an Air Quality and Climate Change Action Plan 2016–2021. A London-wide issue.

The existing Westway advertising tower is being decommissioned and dismantled.

It has been there since 2008 following planning permission granted by the Planning Inspectorate.

JC Decaux appealed against the RBKC enforcement notice. This time the Planning Inspector noted that the tower stands in the middle of the view down Highlever Road, and refused the appeal.



London Realty as agents for the Legards and Metropolis Property Ltd have cleared the site for use by four firms, including Evergreen Pots and Soil. RBKC planners advise that only uses similar to that established by Clifton Nurseries from 1960s to 2015 will be accepted as lawful use. Works to the trees have to be approved by RBKC.
